Northeastern REMC artists win big

Area students take 8 of 14 prizes in state art contest

The 27th annual Cooperative Calendar of Student Art Contest winners were recently announced, with Northeastern REMC area students being awarded eight of the 14 top prizes. Cassidy Skinner, a high school junior from South Whitley, was named Artist of the Year for her lifelike scratchboard art of a dog. Skinner also won both first place and honorable mention for the 11th grade category.

The art contest is open to any Indiana K-12 student. The artwork was judged on artistic merit, originality, creativity, and suitability for a wall calendar. The art contest is open to any Indiana K-12 student. Approximately 2,500 pieces of artwork were entered in this year's competition.





Don't fall for a utility scam. Here's what to do.

Someone calls claiming to be from Northeastern REMC and says your power will be cut off if you don't pay immediately using a gift card. **This is a scam.** Scammers want you to think you have no time to confirm what they're saying. They will also suggest payment methods that are not trackable, such as reloadable gift cards. What should you do immediately? **Hang up and call us.**

It's also essential to make sure you're actually calling Northeastern REMC. Scammers are now using search engines, like Google, to trick people into calling them instead of the co-op. Please verify that the phone number you are calling is Northeastern REMC. Program it into your phone now!


What to do if you paid the scammer

Scammers often ask you to pay in ways that make it tough to get your money back. No matter how you paid a scammer, the sooner you act, the better.



CREDIT OR DEBIT CARD

Contact the company or bank that issued the credit card or debit card. Tell them it was a fraudulent charge.



BANK ACCOUNT TRANSFER

Contact your bank and tell them you did not authorize this debit or withdrawal.



MONEY TRANSFER APP

Report the transaction in the app. If the app is linked to a card, report the fraud to your credit card company.



While third-party payment sites and apps may seem convenient, their payments are not always immediate. DOXO, MoneyGram, and other online payment services may not make the payment immediately on your behalf, resulting in late fees and even disconnected electric service. Plus, those services will also charge you user fees.

For a secure and convenient payment experience, we recommend making your online payments directly through our website, nremc.com, or by using the SmartHub app. You can also sign up for automatic payments so your payment is never late.
