# Right tree. Right place.

Your tree may be small now, but it could be towering above you in a few years. Therefore, it's essential to consider the location of overhead and underground power lines before you plant your tree and know how tall your tree will be at peak maturity.

### **LOW TREE ZONE**

Avoid planting within 20 ft. of power lines. If planting is unavoidable, only plant shrubs and small trees that reach a mature height of 15 ft. or less.

### **MEDIUM TREE ZONE**

Plant medium trees (under 40 ft. when mature) at least 25 ft. away from power lines.

#### **LARGE TREE ZONE**

Plant large trees (over 40 ft. when mature) at least 50 ft. away from power lines.






